Severe Weather Travel

Vehicle Emergency Equipment

Vehicles which are used in areas of severe weather conditions should be equipped with the following:

- First Aid Kit
- Jack
- Sand
- Maps
- Flares
- Tow Chain
- Spare Tire
- Tire Wrench
- Shovel
- Booster Cables
- Flashlight

Emergency Survival Kits

An Emergency Survival Kit should always be taken along when travelling long distances or with the possibility of inclement weather and should include:

- Matches
- Tin Can
- Plastic Tarp
- Change of Clothes
- Food Rations
- Candles
- Warm Socks
- Blankets
- Fire Starter
- Warm Hat and Mitts

If You Get Stuck or Stalled

- It is vitally important that you stay in the vehicle protected from the weather and keep dry and warm. Stay calm, relaxed and awake.
- Avoid over-exertion and exposure.
- Keep fresh air in the car by opening a window approximately 1/2" on the side away from the wind and drifting snow.
- Run motor sparingly ensuring the exhaust pipe is not blocked by snow. Listen to your radio for updates.
- Use the candle to provide warmth.
- Set out warning lights or flares.
- Keep moving and do not fall asleep.
- Keep watch for traffic or searchers.
